The director can tell how well and how often you practice by how well you play each day. Remember, honesty is what you do when people are watching. Integrity is what you do when people are not. Demonstrate integrity when completing your practice report.

Record everything you practiced. When describing things practiced, you should write which number from the book, OR musical vocabulary including articulation, dynamics, high-buzz/low-buzz, fingerings and so on.

Record your minutes practiced. Add up your total minutes at the end of each week.

Have your parent(s)/guardian initial every day you practiced.

Every week, rate your overall effort for the week, and think about how you can improve in the next week.

- A Worked extremely hard in practicing (practiced 5 days, 15+ minutes) / wrote down everything in practice log, detailed information.

- C Occasionally practice (practice 3 days, 15+ minutes) / wrote down material practiced occasionally in practice log, just enough information.
- D Seldom practice (infrequent practice schedule, 10+ minutes) / wrote down material practiced, but forgot sometimes, vague information.
- F No effort to practice (did not attempt to improve on my instrument) / made no effort to write material on practice log.
